## "Speak to us of Children"

As the new school term and academic year begin, we are all hoping that our children's education will not be further affected. Over the past eighteen months parents have had to become home educators while often juggling the home office at the same time. Despite all this thanks to huge efforts by everyone our children got their results and have been able to move onto the next stage in their education.

A couple of weeks ago social media was full of photographs of children in their new school uniforms, ready for that important first day at school. Kate and I remember these days well and the tears that were shed at the time. I'm sorry to say to younger parents that it doesn't get any easier. We are on the final stage of the journey for both our son's Alex and Ben. Alex has finished his university education and training for the theatre and yesterday I drove him to his new home in London to begin his career. Ben will begin university in Bristol next week and I know as we drive home Kate, and I will shed a tear as we did when we saw them walk into their primary school all those years ago. The vicarage will seem strangely quite with both boys gone. However, I am assured by parents who have already walk this road not to worry as they'll be back before you know it!

All of this reminds me of the writings of Kahlil Gibran in his book The Prophet. Kahlil was a Maronite Christian brought up in Lebanon. Kate and I were given a copy of this on our wedding day. I have always remembered what he said about children.

Letting go is probably the most difficult part of parenthood and it arrives all to quickly and you wonder if you have managed to keep the bow straight and true despite all that life throws at us.

Kate and I feel like we are starting the first day of school, as a new chapter opens in the lives of our children, so a new one begins for us, trying to remember what we did together before the kids turned up.

However just because the children are gone doesn't mean you can't play a part in the lives of the next generation. We are blessed at Handley to have a fantastic First School, Little Pennies, and 1st Woodcutts Scouts. All of these need help from people to ensure the best futures for our young people. Becoming a School Governor, Reading Assistant or Scout Leader are ways to help invest in the future of our young people in this village.

In September we had a big celebration of all that 1st Woodcutts have achieved. First and foremost was the recognition of Skip "John Curtis" being presented with 60 year's service certificate. Skip Skip Rob Easton got his 20 years certificate. The largest number of leaders for any troop all received their Wood Badge and it was a real honour to receive them at the same time as my youngest son Ben. Let your bending in the archer's hand be for gladness;

For even as He loves the arrow that flies, so He loves also the bow that is stable.
